**599. PLANNING APPLICATIONS**

**i) 04/6563/P/RET**

*Retention of double gates (1.9M high overall), brick boundary wall/railings and 1.6M high wooden panels to front of semi detached house at 86 Millfield Road, Thorne for S. D. Tattersall.*

**RESOLVED: No observations.**

**ii) 04/6628/P/FUL**

*Erection of two storey pitched roof extension to side / rear including installation of new pitched roof dormer window to rear elevation of semi detached house at 65 Kirton Lane, Thorne for Mr and Mrs Beardon.*

**RESOLVED: No observations.**

**iii) 04/6709/P/FUL**

*Erection of 3.0M high paladin fencing and 2.0M high timber fencing following demolition of existing block work/brick wall at Howarth Timber (Thorne) Ltd., South Parade, Thorne.*

**RESOLVED: Object on the basis that the metal fencing proposed was unsuitable at this sensitive location in the conservation area.**

*Erection of two storey annexe (42.0M x 12.2M overall) to form 24 additional bedrooms, ground floor kitchen extension (7.3M x 5.5M) and link extension (1.7M x 8.0M) to existing public house – The Punchbowl, Thorne for Old Mill Brewery.*

*Outline application for residential development on approximately 0.08HA of land (being renewal of permission previously granted under ref. 01/3424/P on 19.10.01) on the site of former Moorville Garage, Marshland Road, Moorends for Mr I. Dicks.*

**600. BONFIRE NIGHT**

*The arrangements for the Council's Firework Display/Bonfire on 5<sup>th</sup> November were discussed. It was reported that the fire would be lit at 6.30pm with the*

*Fireworks starting at 6.45pm.*

*This year a professional company had been engaged to put on the display, with the same budget as in previous years. It was thought that this would provide a better display because Category 4 fireworks could be used which also gave less fallout which had been a problem in the past, particularly in respect of the adjacent mobile home park. The Town Council would be in overall charge of the event and be responsible for safety, crowd control etc. The event was covered by the Council's insurance.*

## **601. REMEMBRANCE DAY**

*It was reported that arrangements had been put in place as follows:*

*At 11.00am on 11<sup>th</sup> November there will be a simple Ceremony at the War Memorial in Thorne Park. There will be a Sergeant Piper and refreshments for Veterans afterwards in the Park Shelter courtesy of the Punch Bowl.*

*At 9.30am there will be a Service and wreath laying at St. Wilfriths Church in Moorends.*

*At 10.30am the Parade will start to assemble in Thorne Park ready for a short commemorative service and wreath laying at the War Memorial at 11.00am. At about 11.15am the parade will move off to Thorne Church via South Parade, Silver Street, Market Place, King Street, Field Road, St. Nicholas Road and Church Balk arriving for the Service at about 11.45am. After the Service a lunch for Veterans would be held at the Sea Cadets HQ, Union Road, Thorne.*

*As well as the wreaths, the Council normally made a contribution for the expenses of the band, the Sea Cadets for the Veterans lunch, the Sergeant Piper and paid for any transport required by the Veterans Community Transport.*

## **602. MOORENDS WELFARE GROUND**

**602.1** *A request had been received to hold flyball (dog training) sessions on the Welfare Ground. The applicants operated on a "not for profit" basis and had experience elsewhere.*

- *Clear up afterwards.*
- *Arrange insurance.*

*They would require use of the toilets and access for one vehicle/trailer.*

**RESOLVED: That use be approved for an initial six month trial period with a cost of £10 per session.**

**602.2** *A request had been received from Red Bear FC to use the No. 1 pitch at Moorends Welfare Ground. This was because they had gone up into a new league with more stringent requirements regarding the standard of the pitch and facilities.*

**RESOLVED: That this use be approved.**

**602.3** *Moorends Rugby League juniors had requested the marking out of a No. 2 rugby pitch. It was thought that the new goal posts previously been supplied by the Council could be used.``*

**RESOLVED: That the creation of a No. 2 pitch be approved.**
